### **Albion March on**

Due to centre of excellence training involving Yorkshire CP FC players the first game was rescheduled, Sporting Albion faced West Midland neighbours Aston Villa. The first half was a close encounter with few chances, the depleted Villa team defending brilliantly, however Nathan Pink opened the account for Albion just before the half time whistle. The second half was all Albion's, quick goals from Rohit Bhardwaj and Thomas Smith put the Albion three up, Farhan Ahmed got one back for the Villa and as quick as a flash ex-villa player Kristian Little scored the final goal for Albion in what was a 4-1 victory.

With the Yorkshire players back they opened up against rivals Man Utd, always a close encounter the home side went close though Josh Percival, but for a great save from Ryon Broadbent in the United goal. Sam McGovern-Scott linked well with Harry Crooke to open the scoring for United, Yorkshire replied with some intricate play Joe Jackson levelling just before the half time whistle. After the restart Craig Taylor put Yorkshire two up connecting to a cross from Josh Percival, United could have levelled a minute later Steven Kitching inches wide of the post. Yorkshire sealed the game with a tremendous goal involving all their players, pass move, pass move straight off the training pitch put Joe Jackson in for his second and a 3-1 win for Yorkshire.

Yorkshire next game was against Everton and with last month's fixture an extremely close encounter, Joel Taylor opened the account for Everton with an individual goal that would have graced 'match of the day', Josh Percival replied with a cracker to level the score and that was how the fixture finished 1-1.

Man Utd then faced Aston Villa and ran out 3-0 winners, Tom Nelson from the penalty spot, Harry Crooke and Sam McGovern Scott the United goal scorers.
