Report under 17's

Manchester United opened the first fixture against EPCP Spurs, united hit the target scoring early on with a Steven Kitching goal straight from the training ground, neat passing involving four united players put Steven through who rounded the keeper to slot the ball home.

Just before half-time Sam McGovern-Scott added a second for united with an unstoppable volley on the edge of the box.
