

Cerebral Palsy Sports 2019 Athletics Series – Licenses Information

In October 2018 Cerebral Palsy Sport were made aware of UKA's new facility accreditation scheme Track Mark. For more information regarding Track Mark visit <https://www.uka.org.uk/governance/facilities/>

From April 2019, venues seeking to host competitions at License Level 2 need to have achieved all 6 units of accreditation in all areas that are applicable to the events they are running.

In planning for the 2019 Athletics Series, Cerebral Palsy Sport contacted venues and discussed what level licenses they would be seeking. All venues chosen for the 2019 series have committed to and are working on achieve the necessary requirements to host level 2 competitions.

As we have to apply for the level license prior to the series starting and the clubs are on-going with their work as it stands the 2019 Series will be licensed as **Level 1** competitions.

The National Championships that will take place on the 21st September at Doncaster Athletics Club is a **Level 2** licensed competition.

The UKA Competition Licence (level 1 and 2) will allow results to go onto Power of 10 and UK Rankings.

Results listed on Power of 10 are considered for domestic squads and as part of GB Team Selections. Athletes will always need a WPA Licence, Classification and eligible MQS for GB Teams. Full GB selection policies are shared on: <https://uka.org.uk/performance/2019-selection-policies/>

Results from the National Championships will be recognised for WPA Rankings.

As the Track Mark process is ongoing we will post up to date information regarding licenses levels as we receive them.
